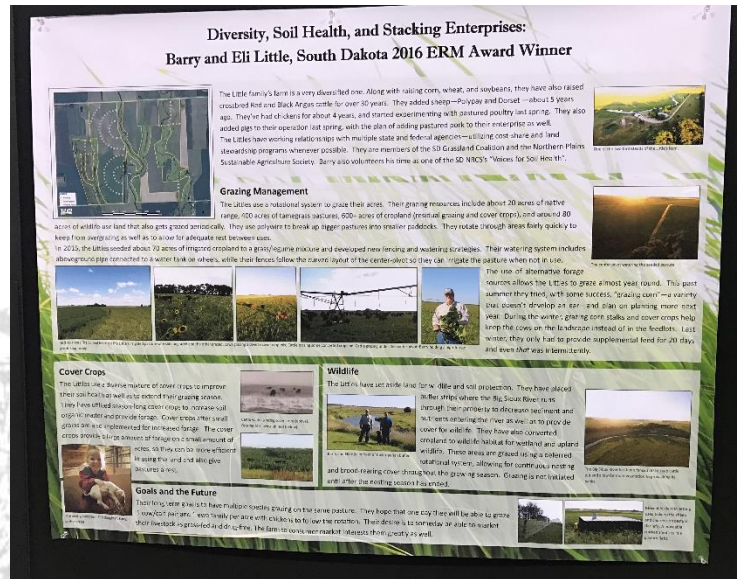




Excellence in Rangeland Management (ERM) Award
